



The process for withdrawal

- ARTICLE 50, TREATY ON EUROPEAN UNION
 - Any Member State may decide to withdraw from the Union in accordance with its own constitutional requirements
- Treaties and all existing directly applicable EU law would cease to apply to the UK from when withdrawal arrangements come into force or failing that, within 2 years of notification.



Contracts

- · Help clients to "future proof" contracts
 - Force Majeure Would EU Exit constitute a force majeure? List this as an event outside a party's control to prevent a breach?
 - Hardship clauses Permit a renegotiation of terms if agreement becomes unprofitable or commerciality of deal is substantially affected.
 - Definition of EU Is there a definition of territorial application and will this therefore be affected?
 - Currency clauses Brexit could create uncertainty around currency.
